A Note from Our Director!

Andy Rash's picture book *Eclipse* is an excellent resource to share with young ones about the upcoming eclipse. The story is based on a real-life road trip Rash took with his son to see the 2017 solar eclipse, and though the eclipse itself was memorable, the memories and connections made with his son were the real takeaway. Most of the APLD service area will be just on the edge of totality for the 2024 Eclipse - not completely dark but pretty darn close - and we are helping patrons be connected to the eclipse multiple ways:

- March 6th, 12:15, SDHS Auditorium: University of Tennessee professor Mark Littman, who wrote Totality, will be speaking to the public; attendees will receive eclipse glasses.
- March 11th while supplies last, APL and DPL: Each APLD member can receive 1 pair of eclipse glasses
- April 8th, 1:30, Dillsboro Public Library: Eclipse Viewing Party; attendees will be given eclipse glasses to view the entire eclipse.
